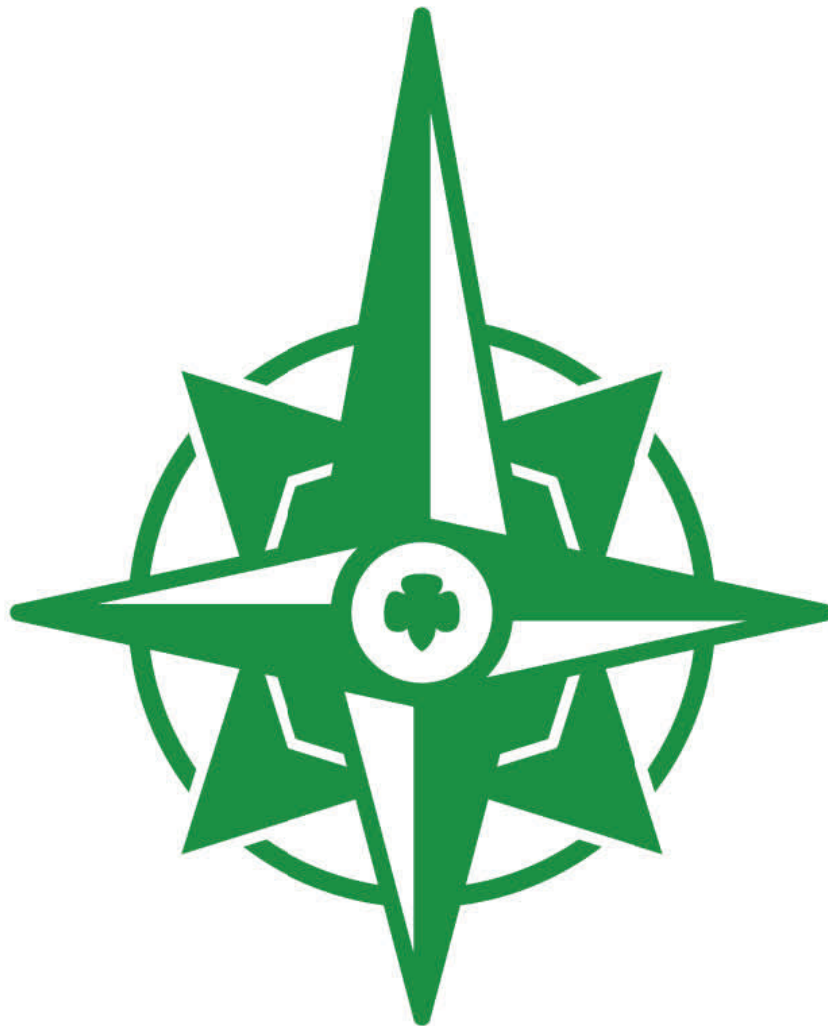

4:30 pm	Go home—be sure to share all the great things you've learned with girls in your troop/group and other people you know. Plan to attend DISCOVEREE again next year!

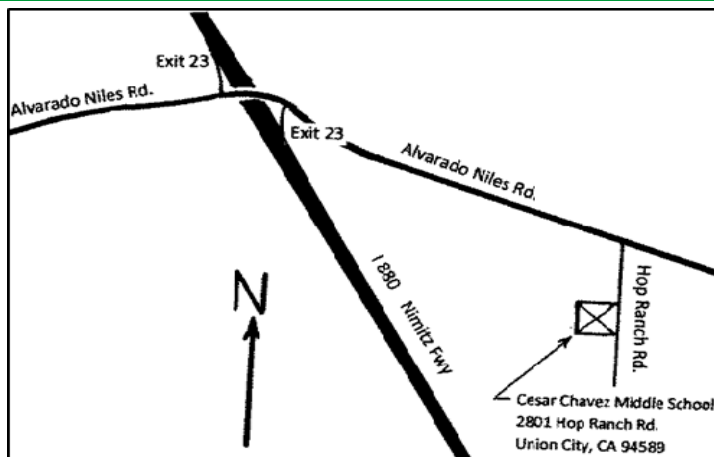
