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One Hundred Fun Hundred Registration Questions

1. **What does OHFH stand for?**
 - a. One Hundred Fun Hundred is Girl Scouts of Northern California's celebration event for Girl Scouts 100th Anniversary.
2. **Can I register my entire troop/group at once?**
 - a. Yes, you can register your entire group / troop at the same time, or individuals can register on their own. We recommend registering together if you are camping and/or taking a shuttle bus together.
3. **How many tickets can we purchase at once?**
 - a. You will be able to purchase up to 60 tickets/bus seats/camping spots at one time.
4. **Can non-girl scout members attend the event?**
 - a. Yes, OHFH is open to all Girl Scouts grades K-12, friends, families, Girl Scout alumnae, Girl Scout adults and the public. Everyone is invited to celebrate Girl Scouts 100th Anniversary!
5. **Do we have to pay in full when we register for the event?**
 - a. Yes, when you register for the event you will need to pay in full for all options you have selected. This includes the event ticket, camping spots and OHFH bus ticket.
 - b. You can pay for the event with a credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover), troop debt card, or the GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card.
6. **Can we purchase event tickets and camping at the same time?**
 - a. Yes, when you go online to purchase your tickets, you will be able to select different options for the event. For example,
 - i. Adult/child ticket to the event.
 - ii. Camping for one night.
 - iii. Camping for two nights
 - iv. Camping for two nights and one round trip bus ticket
 1. You will be able to select different departure times and locations.
 - v. Camping for one night and one round trip bus ticket.
 1. You will be able to select different departure times and locations.
7. **Do we have to purchase tickets and camping at the same time?**
 - a. Yes, we encourage groups to purchase their desired options at the same time.
 - b. Please discuss your plans in advance with those you are purchasing tickets for so the registration process is easy when you register for the event.
8. **What forms of payment can we use?**
 - a. We accept American Express, Discover, MasterCard, Visa or a troop debt card. Girls will also be able to use their GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card as payment for all event options. If you want to pay

for a girl registration using the GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card, you will need to register these individuals using the [OHFH GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card Registration Form](#).

9. How do I register girls in my troop using the OHFH GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card Registration Form?

- a. Please download the [OHFH GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card Registration Form](#) and fill out for the girls using this method of payment ONLY.
- b. Please include the group lead on the form so we know what group to match the girl registration with especially if you are camping or taking the OHFH Bus to the event.
- c. Please send the forms to the Registration Department in the San Jose Office at 1310 S. Bascom Ave. San Jose, CA 95128 or fax (408) 287-8025.

10. Can infants/ toddlers under 3 years old attend the event and what are the fees?

- a. Yes, this event is open to families including infants and toddlers.
- b. Children under 3 years of age will be able to attend the event for FREE and do NOT require a ticket.
- c. Please indicate the number of children under 3 with your group when asked during the registration process.
- d. Children under 3 years of age will also be able to camp for FREE. Please include them in your numbers when you register for the event.
- e. Children under 3 years of age will also be able to ride the OHFH Bus for FREE. Please include them in your numbers when you register for the event so we can ensure to have a seat for them on the bus.

11. How long do we have to register for OHFH?

- a. Registration will be open up until and including the day of the event.
- b. Online registration will close on April 27. Anyone that wants to purchase a ticket after this date can buy it at the any of the three entrance points to the event.

12. What are the price brackets for the event?

- a. Prices vary depending upon when you register for the event.
 - i. Early Bird prices will be the cheapest and are available from Nov. 1 thru Jan. 4, 2012,
 - ii. Regular Registration is open from Jan. 5 to March 31, and
 - iii. Late registration is open from April 1 to May 5.
 - iv. Bus registration will close on March 31. We will be unable to accept "late registration" for buses.

13. What time does registration open on November 1?

- a. Registration opens online at 10 a.m. on November 1, 2011.

14. Why would people register at 10 a.m. on opening day?

- a. The first 2,500 people to register for the event will receive guaranteed seating to watch the Grand Finale live in the Amphitheater. This process is setup as a first come first served process.
- b. People who register after the first 2,500 spots are sold will be able to watch the Grand Finale from the grass on 3 large LCD screens.
- c. We have set aside 125 tickets for girls that register on day one using the *OHFH GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card Registration Form*.

15. How long do we have to register for Tent Camping and the OHFH Bus?

- a. The deadline to register for camping and the OHFH Bus is April 1, 2012 or until these options are sold out – whichever comes first.
 - i. We have camping space available for 6,000 people.
 - ii. We have 2,000 bus tickets for participants from the 10 Northern GSNorCal Counties.

16. Can we replace a girl participant with an adult participant or vice versa?

- a. Yes, you can replace adults and girls within your group at any time. If you have more people that want to join you at the event, they can also purchase tickets leading up to and on the day of the event.

17. Are tickets transferable?

- a. Yes, your ticket to the event is transferable to somebody else.
- b. These tickets are printed with a bar code that will be scanned at the door like a concert or theatre ticket.

18. **Someone in our group can no longer attend the event; can we get a refund for their ticket?**
- There are NO refunds for OHFH. There are no exceptions to this policy.
 - If you are unable to use your ticket for the event, you can sell it for the face value of the ticket to someone else.
19. **What is the refund policy for One Hundred Fun Hundred?**
- There are NO refunds for OHFH. There are no exceptions to this policy.
 - If you are unable to use your ticket for the event, you can sell it to someone else.
 - If you are planning to volunteer for the event, you must sign up to volunteer in advance in order to receive the OHFH Volunteer Discount Coupon Code. We are unable to give refunds for volunteers that purchase tickets before being approved.
 - If you want to use GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card to pay for a girl's registration fee, you must submit the registration for her in writing using the special GSNorCal Cookie/Fall Rewards Card Registration Form. Refunds will NOT be issued for groups that purchase tickets online then want to use GS NorCal Cookie Credits afterwards.

Event Logistic Questions

20. **Can girls attend this event alone?**
- No unaccompanied minors may attend the event. All children ages 0-17 must be accompanied by an adult.
21. **Can I bring outside food or drink into the Alameda County Fairgrounds?**
- Yes, you will be able to bring drinks and food into the event.
 - County fair style food will be provided throughout the event.
 - You will be able to go in and out of the event provided that you keep your OHFH event wristband on at all times.
22. **Is lunch included at the event?**
- No food is included in the event fee. Please bring your own food or plan to purchase food from the vendors at the event.
23. **How much will food cost at the event?**
- The food vendors at OHFH are the same type of vendors you would see at a county fair. Please plan for food prices and types of food similar to those at an amusement park or county fair.
24. **Will the games and activities offered Friday night and/or on the day of the event cost extra?**
- All activities, games, and crafts are included in the price of the ticket.
 - Food and items purchased at the Girl Scout Store will cost extra.
25. **How much extra money does each girl need for the event?**
- Girls will need extra money for food and souvenirs purchased at the Girl Scout store.
26. **Where do I park if I am attending the event and how much is parking?**
- Alameda County Fairgrounds controls all parking and has large lots that will be available for participants.
 - Parking costs \$8 per vehicle, and there are no in-and-out privileges.
27. **What type of weather should we expect on the day of the event?**
- We expect warm, sunny weather in May. Please check local weather closer to the event at www.weather.com and search for Pleasanton, CA.
28. **How can I volunteer for the event?**
- Please visit the One Hundred Fun Hundred webpage at www.girlscoutsnorcal.org/onehundredfunhundred for volunteer information, and to fill out the [OHFH Volunteer Form](#).
 - Once we receive the completed OHFH Volunteer Form, we will notify you via email that you are approved to volunteer at the event. The email confirmation will include registration instructions and

the special discount code for the event. Once you receive the special discount code, you can register online for the event.

- c. **IMPORTANT:** Volunteers need to sign up under the Volunteer Ticket option when registering for the event. If you purchase general admission ticket for volunteers, the discount will not apply to this ticket option. Please register individuals not volunteering under the general admission ticket only.
- d. Volunteer shifts are a minimum of 3 hours, and are available to adults and older girls 11-17 only.

29. Can I take the bus and stay in a hotel?

- a. No, we are unable to offer this option.
- b. If you would like to stay in a hotel, you can drive or rent a charter bus on your own.

30. Will activities be accessible to all participants?

- a. We strive to make sure that activities are accessible to all girls and attendees.
- b. A few activities such as rock climbing and zip lining have age level restrictions.
- c. There will be wheelchair accessible shuttles available from BART stations and accessible facilities at the fairgrounds.

31. Should we wear our vests?

- a. Yes, you can! If you do, please make sure each girls vest is labeled with her name and phone number.
- b. We suggest wearing matching outfits so you can easily find your troop in a large crowd. Plus, the girls will have a fabulous time designing their matching outfits!

32. What are SWAPS?

- a. SWAPS stands for: Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere
- b. For swap ideas and more info, check online!

33. How many swaps should we bring?

- a. Ask the girls how many swaps they want to come home with and that will set your swap number. We suggest making inexpensive swaps in large quantity.
- b. The girls will be able to swap with more troops if they make individual swaps versus the same troop swap.

34. How do we get to the event if I am not taking an OHFH Bus?

- a. Each group is responsible for getting to and from the event unless you purchased a ticket for the OHFH Bus.
- b. Please drive, use public transportation, rent a car, taxi, limo, etc. to get to the event.
- c. If public transportation is not possible for your group, there are plenty of parking spots at the event.
- d. If you are being dropped off at the event, please make arrangements with your driver in advance on where you will be picked up from the event.

35. What if we rent a charter bus?

- a. If you are driving instead of flying, renting a charter bus may be a cheaper alternative for your group.
- b. Charter buses can also be used to transport your group around San Francisco for the weekend.
- c. Charter buses are not required to participate in this event.
- d. Charter bus drop off information will be provided to groups in the Adventure Packet, which will be emailed to participants on Friday, January 13, 2012.

36. When we will receive more information about this event?

- a. When we receive your registration, you will be sent a receipt via e-mail (troop leaders will receive confirmation for group registrations) from our online registration company. This lets you know you have been registered in the event. Please be sure to print your electronic tickets for the event/camping/bussing and bring them to the event.
- b. The OHFH Adventure Packet will be emailed to the lead group contact on Friday, January 13, 2012. All groups are required to have an active email address for easy communication with the council.

37. Is it possible to bring an RV to the event?

- a. Absolutely! RV camping is available at the Alameda County Fairgrounds. Spaces are limited and must be reserved directly through the fairgrounds' reservation system. We highly recommend participants reserve RV spots early as this is a public campground.
- b. Pricing for RV Camping is dependent upon size of RV and what types of hook ups your RV requires. The RV Camping is adjacent to the fairgrounds so you can walk to the evening festivities as well as the main event. The campground has great amenities, including an on-site cafe. 38. What are the sleeping arrangements for the event in the camping area?

- a. If female adults will sleep in tents with the girls, you must have more than one unrelated and screened woman with more than one unrelated girl in the tent.
- b. If your troop is camping with men or boys, they must sleep in tents with their immediate family members ONLY or by themselves (or boys may be in tents with other boys).

39. Who must register as a Girl Scout volunteer?

- a. An adult must be a registered member if she/he will:
 - i. Work with, drive or supervise Girl Scouts
 - ii. Work with money (or cookie or fall sales products)
 - iii. Work with girls' or other adults' personal information

40. Who must get screened to become a Girl Scout volunteer?

- a. An adult must complete the screening process if she/he will:
 - i. Work with, drive or supervise Girl Scouts
 - ii. Work with money (or cookie or fall sales products)
 - iii. Work with girls' or other adults' personal information
 - iv. Attend an overnight activity

41. If we are attending OHFH as a family, do we have to be registered as Girl Scouts, and do the adults have to be screened volunteers?

- a. No, you do not. Only if you will be supervising Girl Scouts who are not related to you do you need to be a registered and screened volunteer.

42. How do I become a registered Girl Scout volunteer?

43. How do I get screened to be a Girl Scout volunteer?

- a. All information about volunteer screening is available online at www.GirlScoutsNorCal.org/screening.

44. Will the event take place rain or shine?

- a. Yes, the event happens rain or shine.

Golden Gate Bridging Questions

45. How is Golden Gate Bridging included at One Hundred Fun Hundred?

- a. For decades, Golden Gate Bridging has been the largest annual bridging event across the country. Countless girls have bridged across the golden span of the bridge and felt the spirit of the Golden Gate Bridge carry them into the older girl program in Girl Scouting.

- b. Normally Golden Gate Bridging involves a gorgeous walk over the bridge and over 6 miles of walking. We have a fun event at Crissy Field in San Francisco that has between 50 – 65 activity booths all offering a variety of games, activities, or crafts. However, what we are offering this year at One Hundred Fun Hundred is many times bigger, better and more exciting than what we can offer at the bridge. One Hundred Fun Hundred is the largest event of its kind on the West Coast and a must see experience for every Girl Scout!
- c. We are building a replica of the Golden Gate Bridge for bridging girls of all ages to walk across during this once in a century event! We will also have fun photo opportunities along the walk.
- d. What could be more special than bridging at the Girl Scouts 100th Anniversary?

46. Is Golden Gate Bridging restricted to a certain age level?

- a. No, for this year ONLY Golden Gate Bridging is open to bridging girls of all ages from across the country, including Ambassadors bridging to adults.
- b. For this year ONLY, Golden Gate Bridging is open to all family members, too.

47. What is the bridging schedule for Saturday, May 5?

- a. As soon as the event schedule for OHFH is finalized, we will post the information on the FAQ and online.

48. How much does it cost to walk the bridge on Sunday, May 6, 2012?

- a. There is no cost to walk the bridge on Sunday, May 6. Girl scouts has purchased the required permit for groups.

49. What is happening at the bridge on Sunday, May 6, 2012?

- a. There will be NO activities offered at the bridge or Crissy Field on Sunday, May 6.
- b. This is not our typical event year because our Golden Gate Bridging event is included in GSNorCal's 100th Anniversary celebration, One Hundred Fun Hundred, on Sat, May 5.
- c. Visiting and walking the Golden Gate Bridge on Sunday, May 6 is an individual and troop event, not a Girl Scout Council sponsored event. There will be no Girl Scout staff or presence other than individual troops walking the bridge as a part of the general public.
- d. This is an opportunity for troops that have traveled to join us for you to celebrate together. It is a powerful experience to see this many Girl Scouts in one area.
- e. Please have a plan on how you will walk the bridge. Please see below for more information.

50. We want to stay in SF for the weekend?

- a. It can be easier for groups to stay close to the desired tourist destinations within the city.
 - i. For example, most troops want to visit Pier 39 and Fisherman's Wharf. This area has numerous site seeing attractions including, Pier 39, Alcatraz, Fisherman's Wharf, Ripley's Believe It or Not, Ghirardelli Square, etc. and is just a cable car ride away from Downtown, Lombard Street, and Chinatown.
- b. We have a number of hotels set up in San Francisco for groups.
 - i. Hilton, Fisherman's Wharf, San Francisco
